From points South;

Take highway 92 west towards the Pacific Ocean. When you reach highway 1 (in Half Moon Bay), turn right and head north. Drive north on highway 1 seven miles to Montara State Beach. Park in the parking lot (formerly the Outrigger Restaurant lot), the gasshuku will be on the beach below.

Please note; rangers advise that “there is no parking available in restaurant lot, parking on the other side of restaurant (South side), is \$10.” It’s unknown if these are enforced rules. Parking is also available on highway 1.

From points North;

Take highway 1 south to Montara State Beach (approximately 21 miles from San Francisco). You will pass through devil’s slide (very windy part of highway 1), before you reach Montara State Beach. Park in the parking lot (formerly the Outrigger Restaurant lot), the gasshuku will be on the beach below. *Please note; rangers advise that “there is no parking available in restaurant lot, parking on the other side of restaurant (South side), is \$10.” It’s unknown if these are enforced rules. Parking is also available on highway 1.*
